Serco, Environmental Enforcement Team, Environmental Protection Officers

### What does good look like?

Well-kept streets with very little litter or fly-tipping, showing care for the neighbourhood.

### How will we deliver this priority?

Monitor street cleaning and publicity of enforcement. Partner with residents for clean-up events, volunteering and awareness campaigns.



## Priority 3 – Town Centre Improvements

### Who will own this priority and how will it be measured?

Regeneration, Assets and Land, Markets

Obtain resident and business feedback as well as data from service areas.

### What does good look like?

The Town Centre is well-kept, clean and bustling. There are plans for previously derelict buildings to come back into use.

### How will we deliver this priority?

Partner with services, residents and businesses to deliver on the Levelling Up Plan. Publicise Town Centre events and opportunities.

## Priority 2 – Improve Highways and Road Safety

### Who will own this priority and how will it be measured?

Police, Highways

Obtain community feedback and enforcement data on traffic, accidents, speeding and parking issues.

### What does good look like?

The rules of the road are respected, and residents feel safer. Roads and footpaths are well maintained.

### How will we deliver this priority?

Target hotspots with awareness campaigns. Publicise road safety, improvements and maintenance work.



## Priority 3 – Reduce Street Drinking

### Who will own this priority and how will it be measured?

Police, ASB Team, Enforcement Protection Officers

Obtain reports of incidents and the enforcement actions taken.

### What does good look like?

Reduced incidents of anti-social behaviour and street drinking.

Residents feel safer and are given feedback.

### How will we deliver this priority?

Share intelligence and run joint operations to work with partners and community groups.

Target hotspots with awareness campaigns, focusing on education around street drinking.
