ORDER**

BEFORE Her Honour Judge Emma Kelly, sitting as a Judge of the High Court in the High Court of Justice, Birmingham District Registry, The Priory Courts, 33 Bull Street, Birmingham, B4 6DS on 27 February 2026.

UPON the Claimants' application, by an Application Notice dated 7 October 2022 for an injunction pursuant to section 222 of the Local Government Act 1972 and section 130 of the Highways Act 1980.

AND UPON the Claimant's application, dated 25 February 2026 for an extension of the current duration of the injunction and power of arrest; permission to discontinue the claim brought by the Second Claimant and relief from sanctions to rely on the witness statement of Mr Sheen, dated 24 February 2026

AND UPON the Court:

- (1) having granted urgent interim relief by way of an Interim Injunction and Power of Arrest, by Order of the Honourable Mrs. Justice Hill sealed on 22 December 2022;
- (2) having reconsidered and reviewed the grant of urgent interim relief, at a hearing on 6 February 2023 before the Honourable Mr Justice Freedman, by an Order sealed on 16 February 2023;
- (3) reviewing and amending the Interim Injunction and Power of Arrest by Order of the Honourable Mr Justice Ritchie made on 19 May 2023;
- (4) reviewing the Interim Injunction and Power of Arrest by order of Her Honour Judge Emma Kelly made on 4 October 2023;
- (5) granting a quasi-final injunction order and power of arrest by order of the Honourable Mr Justice Julian Knowles on 27 February 2024; and
- (6) making further amendments to the Injunction and Power of Arrest:
 - by the joinder of additional defendants (the identities of such Defendants being set out in Schedule 1 together with the date of joinder and the judge making such order) and;
 - define more precisely the description of the First to Fourth Defendantsby order of the Honourable Mr Justice Ritchie made on 26

February 2025

AND UPON Her Honour Judge Emma Kelly reviewing the operation of the quasi-final injunction and power of arrest on 26 February 2026 and making a revised injunction and power of arrest

AND UPON hearing Counsel, Mr Singleton, for the Claimants and none of the Defendants attending nor having indicated any intention to attend.

AND UPON the Court accepting that the Defendants had been notified of the review hearing taking into account the 25th and 26th witness statements of Paul Brown, dated 24 December 2025 and 6 February 2026.

AND UPON the Court considering the updating written evidence of:

- (1) Pardip Nagra, dated 2 February 2026;
- (2) PC Mark Campbell, dated 29 December 2025;
- (3) Adam Sheen, dated 24 February 2026.

AND UPON the Claimants having brought to the attention of the Court any matter which the First, Second, Third and Fourth Defendants might wish to raise as potential material changes in legal and/or factual circumstances which could warrant the discharge of the injunction of the power of arrest dated 27 February 2024.

AND UPON the Court being satisfied that the discontinuance of the claim brought by the Second Claimant does not justify the discharge of the injunction and power of arrest **but** that injunction and power of arrest require further amendment to reflect the discontinuance of the claim by the Second Claimant.

AND UPON this Court making a revised quasi-final injunction and power of arrest which are issued alongside this order.

AND UPON this order determining the Claimants' application, dated 24 February 2026, pursuant to CPR 23.9 without service of a copy of the application notice

IT IS ORDERED THAT:

Definition

1. "These Orders" shall mean the totality of (a) this order, (b) the varied quasi-final injunction made today, and (b) the revised power of arrest made today.

Varied quasi-final injunction and power of arrest

2. A varied quasi-final injunction and power of arrest are made in the terms

of the orders issued alongside this order.

Discontinuance by the Second Claimant

3. Permission is granted, pursuant to CPR 38.2, to the Second Claimant to discontinue its claim.
4. The Second Claimant shall forthwith file and serve Notices of Discontinuance, as required by CPR 38.3.
5. The Second Claimant shall by 4.00pm on 27 March 2026 remove all road signage installed in its local authority area, pursuant to paragraph 5(f) of the order of the Honourable Mr Justice Julian Knowles made on 27th February 2024, indicating that a High Court Injunction is in force.
6. The First, Third and Fourth Claimants shall by 4.00pm 27 March 2026 cover up, obscure or delete any reference to the Second Claimant on any signage, installed in their respective local authority areas, pursuant to paragraph 5(f) of the order Honourable Mr Justice Julian Knowles made on 27th February 2024.

Relief from sanctions

7. So far as may be necessary, the Claimants are granted relief from any sanctions flowing from a failure to file the witness statement of Mr Adam Sheen, dated 24 February 2026, not less than 14 days before the hearing, as required by paragraph 2 of the directions order of the Honourable Mr Justice Ritchie dated 26 February 2026. Permission is granted for the Claimants to rely on Mr Sheen's said witness statement.

Service on the First to Fourth Defendants ('Persons Unknown')

8. Pursuant to CPR 6.15, 6.27 and 81.4(2) (c) and (d), the Claimants shall be permitted to serve These Orders on the First to Fourth Defendants by the alternative methods specified at Schedule 2 to this Order.
9. The deemed date of service of These Orders on the First to Fourth Defendants shall be 23.59 hours on the completion of the final step of service required by paragraph 1 of Schedule 2 to this Order. The Claimants must verify completion of those steps by a witness statement or certificate of service to be filed at Court and uploaded to the Claimants' dedicated webpages referred to at paragraph 1(iii) of Schedule 2 to this Order within 7 days of completing those steps. Service of the said witness statement on the First to Fourth Defendants is dispensed with.

Service on the Named Defendants

10. Pursuant to CPR rules 6.15, 6.27 and 81.4(2) (c) and (d), the Claimants shall be permitted to serve These Orders on the Named Defendants using email and/or postal addresses that have been provided to the Claimants in the course of these proceedings. Service to be effected by 4.00pm on 20 March 2026.

Setting aside or varying this order

11. By this order the Court has disposed of the Claimants' application of 24 February 2026 without service of a copy of the application notice. Any person who was not served with a copy of the application notice may apply to have the aspect(s) of the order that relate to the application (i.e. orders relating to discontinuance, relief from sanctions and extension of term of the injunction) set aside or varied, with any such application to be made within 7 days after the date on which the order was served on the person making the application.
12. In addition or in the alternative to any entitlement under paragraph 11 of this order, any person served with a copy of, or affected by, this order may apply to the Court to vary or discharge it, on 48 hours' written notice to the Claimants at the address set out at the foot of this Order.

Costs

13. There shall be no order as to costs.

TWENTY SEVENTH WITNESS STATEMENT OF PAUL STEVEN BROWN

I, PAUL STEVEN BROWN of the City of Wolverhampton Council, Civic Centre, St Peters Square, Wolverhampton, WV1 1RG, WILL SAY AS FOLLOWS:

1. Except where indicated to the contrary, the facts in this statement are within my knowledge and are true. Where the facts in this statement are not within my direct knowledge, they are based on the source indicated and are true to the best of my information and belief. This is my 27th statement in these proceedings.
2. The City of Wolverhampton Council is the authority which is leading the joint application of the Councils of Wolverhampton, Sandwell and Walsall seeking

injunctive relief to restrain street racing (also referred to as car cruising) in the three boroughs. This is a statement on behalf of all three Claimants.

3. I have been employed since 25 June 2007 as a Senior Communications Adviser and latterly Communications Manager in the communications team of the City of Wolverhampton Council.
4. In collaboration with my colleagues Pardip Nagra (ASB Team Leader) and Adam Sheen (Senior Solicitor and Acting Lead Lawyer, Litigation Team, Legal Services) a communications plan has been developed, initially to raise awareness of the application to the High Court for a street racing injunction for Wolverhampton, Sandwell and Walsall and, after it was granted, to promote the existence of the injunction and the Power of Arrest which is in place.
5. Recognising this is a joint enterprise, I have been liaising closely with my counterparts in the communications teams of Sandwell and Walsall Councils and West Midlands Police.
6. Schedule 2 of the High Court order made by HHJ Kelly on 26 February, 2026, required the Claimants to complete a series of steps before 23:59 on 20 March 2026 to publicise the outcome of the hearing and bring it to the attention of "Persons Unknown".
7. The order of 26 February 2026 required:

Issuing a media release concerning the continuance of the quasi-final injunction, as revised, and power of arrest, which provides:

- (a) a summary of the effect of the revised injunction, power of arrest and the discontinuance of the Second Claimant's claim;
- (b) the addresses of the dedicated webpages maintained by the Claimants regarding street cruising;
- (c) the Claimants' contact details as set out above; and
- (d) details of where and how copies of the revised quasi-final injunction, power of arrest, this order and the claim documents may be obtained.

"To the extent that overall street cruising activity has reduced from that seen prior to injunctive relief being in place, it is well established that evidence of that kind is not evidence that the risk has abated."

- "drifting" - turning by placing the vehicle in a skid so that most sideways motion is due to the skid not any significant steering input
- "undertaking" - Passing a vehicle on its nearside so as to overtake in circumstances not permitted by the Highway Code.

The injunction and power of arrest will remain in force until at least 1 March 2027.

Full details of the injunction, including evidence presented to the High Court, the Sealed Order, power of arrest, a map showing the three local authority areas and other supporting documentation, can be found in our [street racing downloads webpage](#).

Incidents of street racing should be [reported online to the council](#) or to West Midlands Police on 101. In an emergency, always dial 999.

The application was led by the City of Wolverhampton Council on behalf of Wolverhampton, Sandwell Council and Walsall Council, and supported by West Midlands Police.
