1 PURPOSE OF THE DIRECTORY

The Domestic Abuse Strategic Partnership has produced this directory as a practical resource for frontline staff, volunteers who work with adults and children and professionals who may come across victims of domestic abuse. It provides information about agencies and the support available in Sandwell as well as key regional and national contacts.

2 WHAT IS DOMESTIC ABUSE AND VIOLENCE?

Domestic Abuse is defined in the <u>Domestic Abuse Act 2021</u> as "any incident or pattern of incidents of physical or sexual abuse, violent or threatening behaviour, controlling or coercive behaviour, economic abuse, psychological, emotional or other abuse between those aged 16 and over or personally connected to each other". Children are recognised as victims of domestic abuse in their own right.

Domestic abuse takes many forms such as:

- physical abuse
- verbal abuse
- emotional and psychological abuse
- sexual abuse
- coercive or controlling behaviour
- economic and financial abuse
- stalking and harassment
- Honour'-based abuse, Forced marriage and FGM

Physical abuse is any violence or any physical force that injures you or puts your health at risk. It is a deliberate act of violence that results in harm, injury, or trauma to a victim's body. It can include pushing, hitting, punching, kicking, nonfatal strangulation and using weapons or objects to hurt you.

Verbal abuse is when somebody uses words and non-physical actions to manipulate, hurt, scare or upset you or doubt your self-worth. Verbal abuse may be aggressive shouting and can include the use of hurtful language used to deliberately upset, mock or threaten somebody.



Emotional and Psychological abuse involve regular and deliberate use of words and non-physical actions to manipulate, hurt, weaken or frighten a person and to distort, confuse or influence their thoughts and actions. Emotional abuse can include constant criticism, insults, humiliation, and threats. Psychological abuse is when someone is subjected or exposed to a situation that can result in psychological trauma, including Anxiety, Depression or Post-traumatic stress disorder. It can involve behaviours such as silent treatment, isolation or gaslighting (making someone doubt their sanity and reality), slowly breaking down a victim's sense of self.

Sexual abuse refers to any action that pressures you to do something sexually you do not want to do. It can include being pressured to have sex without your consent (rape), unwanted sexual activity, touching, groping or being made to watch pornography. It can also refer to behaviour that impacts a person's ability to control their sexual activity such as restricting access to birth control, refusing condoms or removing condoms (stealthing) without consent.

Coercive and Controlling abuse are behaviours that are often found together but are slightly different. Coercive behaviour is an act or a pattern of acts of assault, threats, humiliation and intimidation or other abuse that is used to harm, punish, or frighten their victim. Controlling behaviour is when one person repeatedly and intentionally exerts power and control over another to undermine their independence and freedom. It includes making a person feel inferior or dependent by isolating them from sources of support, exploiting their resources and capacities for personal gain and regulating their everyday behaviour.

Economic and financial abuse is part of coercive control, where money is used to control or cause harm to someone. Financial abuse is preventing someone from accessing, using or maintaining money. Economic abuse is when an abuser controls freedom by preventing access to employment, food and housing. It may include restricting access to transport and technology, denying daily essential like food and clothing, refusing to contribute to household costs, taking your wages, checking receipts, forcing a victim to stop working to prevent connecting with others.

Stalking and Harassment abuse are both offences related to behaviour that is repeated and unwanted. Stalking is a pattern of Fixated, Obsessive, Unwanted, Repeated (FOUR) behaviour which is intrusive and causes fear of violence and distress in the victim. Cyberstalking (digital abuse) can include surveillance, hacking social media accounts or restricting access, tracking location devices, impersonating victims, or receiving direct threats online. Harassment is behaviour intended to cause a person alarm or distress. The behaviour must occur on more than one occasion, but it does not have the be the same kind of behaviour on each occasion. It can include regularly receiving unwanted texts, voicemails, gifts, being followed, turning up outside someone's hour or work.



Honour-based abuse (HBA) or honour-base violence (HBV) are practices used to control behaviour within families to protect perceived cultural and religious beliefs and so called 'honour'. It is often committed with some degree of approval or collusion from family and/or community members, to prevent 'dishonour' or shame bring brough upon a family or community.

Forced marriage abuse is a marriage where one or both partners do not (or in cases of people with learning disabilities or reduced capacity, cannot) consent to the marriage. A forced marriage is very different from an arranged marriage, which is done with consent by both parties. Victims of forced marriage may feel unable to say no due to consequences from relatives, friends or community if resisting the married.

Female Genital Mutilation (FGM) abuse is a procedure performed on a woman or girl to partially or fully remove her external genitalia, or to damage or change her genitalia for non-medical reasons. It is very painful and can have serious health impacts on women and girls, including constant pain, problems with sex, childbirth and mental health. It can cause psychological trauma and be life-threatening, as it is often carried out by a non-professional.

3 MARAC & DASH

MARAC (multi-agency risk assessment conference) is a multi-agency meeting to support high risk victims of domestic abuse. Professionals share information about the risks faced by victims who have been referred, the actions needed to ensure their safety and to identify resources available locally to create a risk management plan involving all agencies.

The main aim of MARAC is to reduce the risk of serious harm or homicide for a victim and to increase the safety, health and wellbeing of victims, and their children. MARAC meetings work on the understanding that no single agency can see the complete picture of the life of a victim, but together all may have insights that are crucial to their safety.

DASH (Domestic Abuse, Stalking, and Harassment) risk identification checklist is a tool used to assess the risk level for individuals experiencing domestic abuse, stalking, or honour-based violence. It helps professionals identify high-risk cases and determine the need for further intervention, often through referral to MARAC.
