Reporting Crime and Anti-Social Behaviour

Crime and anti-social behaviour can have devastating effects on residents and communities. By reporting incidents, you help us ensure the right resources are allocated to prevent and tackle these issues effectively.

This leaflet provides key contact details for reporting crime or anti-social behaviour if you are a victim or witness.

Police

- Call 999 in emergency - If you have a hearing or speech impairment and you've pre-registered with the emergency SMS service, you can use the textphone service on 18000 or text on 999
- Call 101 in non-emergency - If you have a hearing or speech impairment, use the textphone service on 18001 101.
- Online - live chat on www.westmidlands.police.uk reporting any concerns
